3. Update from Practice	
<ul> <li>Staff changes – New receptionist starting in the next few weeks. She has a lot of prior experience working in another surgery and also has some experience in data management. We look forward to welcoming her to the practice.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Appointments – From a practice perspective it seems these are being managed well at present with pre-bookables always available within the next 14 days and usually less than this and on the day appointments available for urgents. New phones system also appears to be working well and practice are not receiving any complaints about the phone system now. Continue to offer Extended access appointments with a nurse or GP on a Tuesday evening, First contact Physiotherapy, Mental health practitioner, Acute visiting service, Frailty service, Care home service and more. Dr Barfield continues to provided minor surgery and joint injections in house. Dr Behan</li> </ul>	

will soon be offering Intrauterine Coil insertion in house.

## 4. Publishing data re missed appointments

Alan reported that the proposal to include more information regarding missed appointments had been delayed because of workload issues. However he reported that the new telephone system had a "Check and Cancel" option which allowed patients to cancel an upcoming appointment without having to talk to a receptionist.

## 5. Update on progress of the Moreton and Meols Collaboration Agreement

Steve reported the last Wallasey Wellbeing PPG Group had been attended by Fiona Harle who was the Operational Lead manager of Moreton and Meols PCN. Fiona agreed that good progress was being made on the new Co-Operation agreement and confirmed that the two PCN's shared a similar vision on how PCN's should work and they shared a similar business approach to employing staff and cooperating with other agencies.

Dr Fletcher reported that the two organisations were working towards one combined organisation but accepted that this will take time and it was better to follow this approach and get the final organisation right. In the meantime the two boards had agreed that Fiona Harle will take over the Operational Management role in both organisations from the middle of December.

Good progress had been made in the "Ageing Well" system where patients were being identified as needing more help to allow them to stay in their own home.

Also the development of integrating community nurses with GP's was having good results and was being recognised nationally.

#### 6. Progress on Autumn RSV, Flu and COVID Vaccine Programme

- Flu Delivered over 1300 flu vaccinations so far. Still working to vaccinate anyone eligible. All eligible patients have either received vaccination or had at least 2 invites now
- RSV All eligible patients have either received the vaccination or received 2 invites. 210 out of 354 eligible 75-80 year olds have now been vaccinated.
- COVID This had been rolled out at VCH together with the national options of using local pharmacies and other venues

### 7. Initial thoughts on the impact of the new Labour Government on GP Services

- Thoughts on Labour Government Practice prefers to remain non-political. Wait to see
  what the new Health secretary has to offer General Practice as currently no details.
  Budgetary changes re rise in NI contributions for employers will significantly impact the
  practice with no provision for general practice currently being made to cover this rise. A
  lot of pressure from BMA for the Health Secretary to make provision for practices with
  regard to this.
- Dr Fletcher also added that the new government was likely to continue supporting the approach of GP Practices working together through Primary Care Networks (PCN's). This was good news.
