Pharmacy First Scheme

From 31st January 2024 the pharmacy first scheme launched which allows patients to access medical advise/medication directly from a pharmacist for several common conditions which removes the need to see the doctor.

Pharmacies can provide medication for:

- 1) **Urinary Tract Infections (UTIs)-** for women aged 16-64 years who have not had two or more UTIs in the previous 6 months. Not for patients who are pregnant/ breast feeding or have a catheter.
- 2) **Shingles**—for patients aged 18 years and over who have had the rash present for between 72 hours and 7 days. Not for pregnant patients.
- 3) Impetigo—for patients aged 1 year and over who have localized non-bullous impetigo (red sores/golden brown crusts) without any systemic symptoms such as a fever. Patients who have had 2 or more episode of impetigo in 12 months are to see a doctor. Not for pregnant patients.

4) Infected Insect Bites— for patients aged 1 and over with localized signs of infection. Patients with systemic symptoms such as a fever or who have been bitten/stung outside the UK are to see a doctor. Not for pregnant patients under 16 years old.

5) Acute Sore Throat—for patients aged 5 years and over who have not had 7 episodes in 12months, 5 in the each of the last 2 years or 3 in each of the last years. Not for pregnant patients under 16 years old.

6) Acute Sinusitis—for patients aged 12 years and over who have had symptoms lasting more than 10 days without improvement. Only for patients who have not had 4 or more episodes in the last 12months. Not for pregnant patients under 16 years old.

7) Acute Otitis Media (Ear Infection Of Middle Ear) - for patients aged 1 to 17 years old. Not suitable for patients with perforated eardrum, discharge from the ear or severe symptoms. Not for pregnant patients under 16 years old or for patients with recurrent episodes (3 or more in the last 6 months, or 4 or more in the last 12 months). Asda pharmacy offer an earache service for adults (18 years and over) with a charge starting from $\pounds 25$.
